

FLOOD DEBRIS

SEPARATE THESE ITEMS FROM OTHER TRASH

Most flood debris can be disposed in one container. EXCEPT:

- **Dangerous wastes – *toxics, pesticides, explosives, gasoline, oil, pool chemicals, acids, drain cleaner, fireworks, flares, ammo, unprotected “sharps”***
- **Hazardous Waste**
- **Oil, Brake Cleaner, other toxic car products**
- **Paint, Stain, Varnish, Paint Thinner/Stripper**
- **Propane cylinders, other gas cylinders**
- **Batteries**
- **Electronics**
- **Mercury products – *fluor. bulbs, thermostats, thermometers***
- **Tires**
- **Large appliances *refrigerators, freezers, stoves, washers, dryers* & Scrap Metal**

If you have flood damaged recyclables or food waste, those materials are acceptable to be disposed of in trash from this flooding event (July 2023).

REGIONAL HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES ARE COMMONLY AVAILABLE FROM SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ENTITIES (SWME). Learn about services by contacting your SWME at www.802recycles.com.

SERVICES VARY, BUT SOME OF THESE ITEMS MAY BE ACCEPTED AT YOUR LOCAL TRANSFER STATION

If leaking, place container in pail. Do not mix chemicals or pour down drain.
